

## A Meaningful Christmas Countdown

## **Ideas for Daily Activities**

Here are a variety of ideas to use for your Christmas countdown cards. You can get creative and come up with your own, but these provide a good start!

- 1. set up a nativity to play with
- 2. purchase dog and cat food and treats, drop off at your local animal shelter
- 3. collect non-perishable food items and donate to the food bank
- 4. make Christmas cards and/or bake nativity-shaped cookies for neighbours
- 5. leave Christmas surprise baskets on neighbours' doorsteps (candy canes, an ornament, a can of cranberry sauce, chocolates, etc.)
- 6. light a candle on your advent wreath
- 7. make Christmas cards for family members
- 8. buy a toy and donate to Santa's Anonymous
- 9. fill a shoebox for Samaritan's Purse
- 10. build a snowman
- 11. go sledding
- 12. go carolling
- 13. collect mitts, scarves, and toques for the homeless
- 14. deliver red and white carnations to residents at a local senior's centre
- 15. write a letter to Jesus
- 16. write a Christmas card and draw a picture for your foster child (if you have one and if you don't, why not get one)
- 17. gather clothes and toys to donate to charity
- 18. organize a hot cocoa stand and donate all proceeds to a charitable cause

- 19. assemble baby care kits (diapers, wipes, swaddle blanket, bum cream, etc.) and drop off at local family shelter
- 20.make a blanket and donate to homeless shelters (I love the fringed fleece blanket on the <u>projectlinus.org</u> website)
- 21. make bookmarks and leave them at the local library
- 22. decorate the house
- 23. make gingerbread houses
- 24. make nativity puppets
- 25. adopt a family and need and provide gifts and food for them for the holiday season
- 26. assemble some blessing bags for homeless people (socks, gum, handwarmers, bus tickets, almonds, a wash cloth, hand cream, a travel toothbrush with toothpaste, lip balm, tissues, hand wipes, granola bars, coffee gift card, etc.)
- 27. collect bottles and donate money to a charitable cause
- 28. make a snowman
- 29. bring Christmas cookies and a card to local community workers (library, fire hall, police station, etc.)
- 30. assemble care bags (shampoo, toothbrush, coffee card, socks, maxi pads, bus tickets, mitts, etc.) for a teen/youth center
- 31. make an ornament for your mail carrier
- 32. pray for the featured country of the day at operationworld.org
- 33. shovel a neighbour's sidewalk
- 34. make ornaments for a tree at a local senior's home
- 35. donate books to a local library
- 36. decorate the home of a sick or less mobile neighbour or family member
- 37. hand out water bottles (with Christmas greetings on them) to joggers
- 38. leave Christmas greetings/cards on park benches and at bus stops
- 39. donate crayons and colouring books to a local children's hospital
- 40. assemble and donate snack packages to local Ronald McDonald House residents
- 41. help deliver Christmas hampers or food for Meals on Wheels
- 42. pick an item from the compassion.ca/shop gift guide and purchase it
- 43. decorate a hospital or a seniors' residence
- 44. host a Sole Hope party and assemble shoes for people in need
- 45. collect and donate unused board games to a youth shelter
